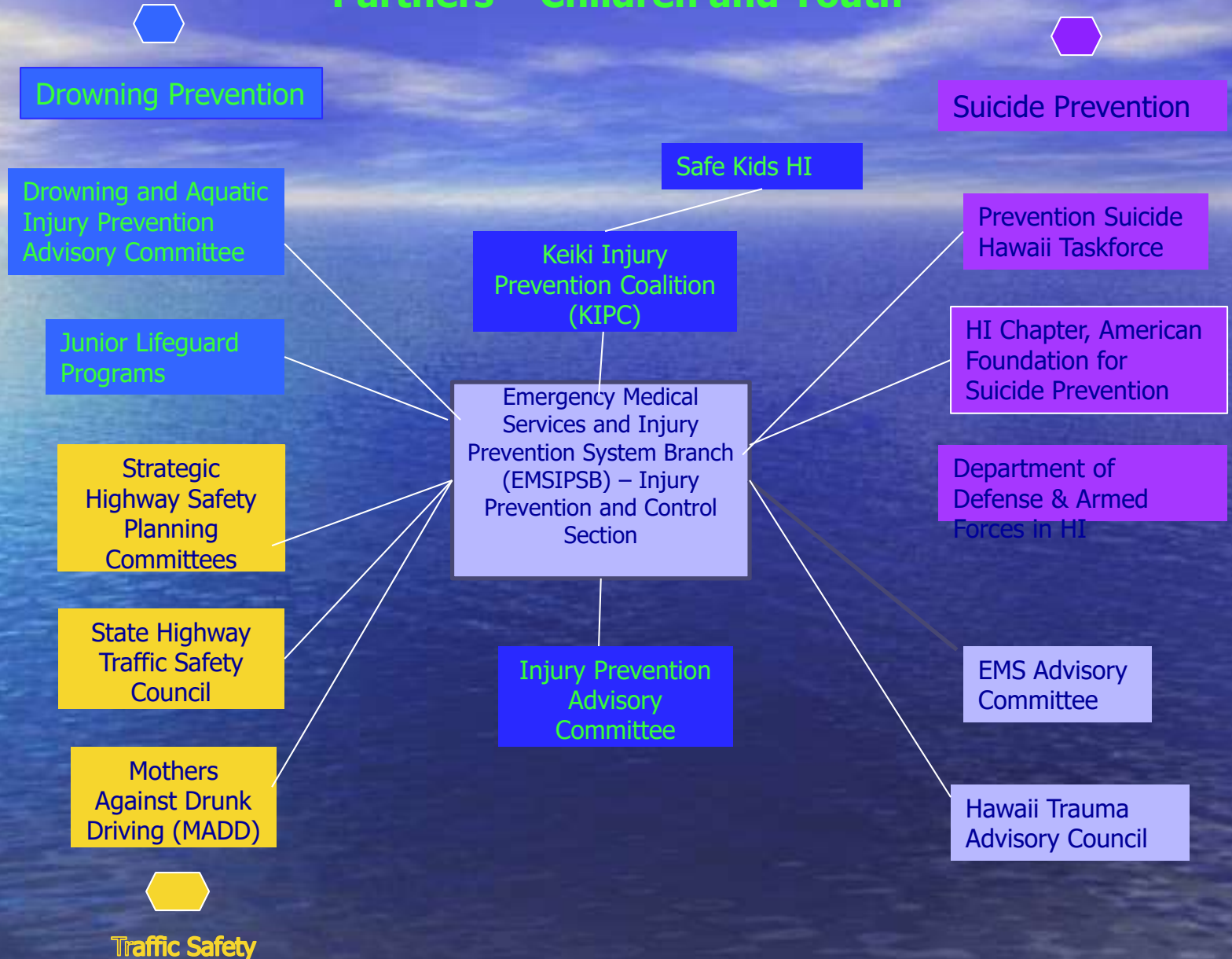
Factors for Determining Injury Focus Areas

- Burden of injury
- Cost to society
- Existence of evidence-based programs & policies
- Feasibility of action
- Potential for prevention – demonstrable & measurable
- Stakeholder/partner support for prevention efforts

Hawaii Tourism Authority (HTA) organizational mission now supports ocean safety; County Ocean Safety agencies' major role is injury prevention

Fostering Coalitions and Networks

Hawaii Drowning and Aquatic Injury Prevention Advisory and Task Force (all counties Ocean Safety & Parks and Recreation, DLNR, HTA, military, coast guard, non-profits)

Educating Providers

National Red Cross & Parks & Recreation building swim instructor capacity in all counties

Promoting Community Education

Collaboration with HTA and Advisory Group on drowning prevention campaign

Strengthening Individual Knowledge and Skills

Parks and Recreation "learn to swim" classes; Junior Lifeguard Programs

	Mobilizing Neighborhoods and Communities Community driven environmental policies to limit access to alcohol; CS & SRTS projects
	Changing Organizational Practices SBI in Level III trauma centers provided for patients ages 10 & up; Honolulu county use of CS & SRTS
	Fostering Coalitions and Networks Strategic Highway Safety Plan Committees; Hawaii Partnership to Prevent Underage Drinking (HPPUD) & MADD
	Educating Providers Impairment recognition training for police officers; Retail & Restaurant Establishment Server Trainings
	Promoting Community Education HPPUD and MADD public education on laws, penalties, and fatality statistics

Spectrum of Prevention- Suicide

Influencing Policy and Legislation HCR0066 PSHTF Subcommittee to reduce suicides by 25% by 2025; annual State funding for SP since 2007

Mobilizing Neighborhoods and Communities American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, HI Chapter (AFSP-HI) organizes survivor outreach, support groups and training; Youth Leadership Council work with peers

Changing Organizational Practices Cognito and mental health first aid training in public schools; HPD trains all recruits & policy for 24/7 crisis response includes suicide

Fostering Coalitions and Networks Prevent Suicide HI Taskforce (statewide and county level), AFSP-HI, Youth Leadership Council, Military

Educating Providers Train the trainer to build capacity and access to gatekeepers in all counties (Evidence-based: ASIST, safeTALK, CONNECT) *

Promoting Community Education Suicide prevention awareness activities and outreach all islands, "Out of Darkness" community walks – all islands; youth suicide prevention messaging

Strengthening Individual Knowledge & Skills Suicide prevention gatekeeper training for professionals, community members – all counties

Suicide Prevention Gatekeeper Trainings



safeTALK

Suicide Alertness for Everyone, Tell, Ask, Listen & KeepSafe

- A 3.5 hour training for everyone in the community and emphasizes the ability to recognize a person at risk for suicide and know how to connect them with a person trained in **suicide first aid intervention**.



ASIST

Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training

- A 2 day training that assists community members and organizations to learn **suicide first aid intervention**. Outcome studies show participants are more willing, ready and able to help a person at risk of suicide.



Training Professionals & Communities in
Suicide Prevention & Response

Training for professionals & communities in suicide prevention & response

- A comprehensive program for professionals and communities in emphasizing prevention and intervention strategies, promoting healing and reducing risk after a suicide. Persons who have survived their own suicide and/or who have family members who have attempted suicide, are trained how to safely share their story privately and publicly.

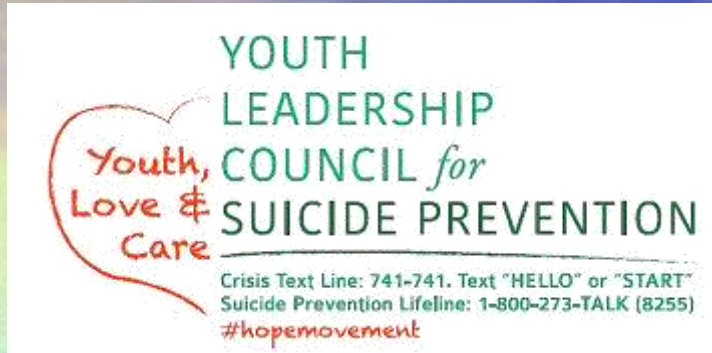
