## Who Do We Serve?

- Home Visiting (HV) services are available in 10 high risk communities across the state.
- HV enrollees are:
  - eligible for services based on federal Maternal, Infant, Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) screening for risk factors
  - primarily biological mothers of children (0-5yrs)
- Enrollees during FY 2016:
  - 61.1% not employed
  - 61.1% single, never married
  - 64.6% Medicaid

- Who are Home Visitors?
  - Trained paraprofessionals that coach and guide families on how to support children.
  - Healthcare advocates that assist families in accessing services
- Home Visitors are NOT:
  - medical professionals
  - family planning counselors

# Goal of OKQ in Home Visiting

- Start a conversation about pregnancy intention
- Provide an overview of preventive care options
- Connect enrollees to pregnancy resources and medical coverage

## Community-Clinical Linkage

# OKQ Implementation

- Target population – female, non-pregnant enrolled primary caregivers
- Data collection – survey based on OKQ Workflow document
  - OKQ survey is a data collection tool used to inform intervention
- Frequency – quarterly to keep up with changing intentions/needs and to track changes in contraceptive methods

# OKQ Pilot

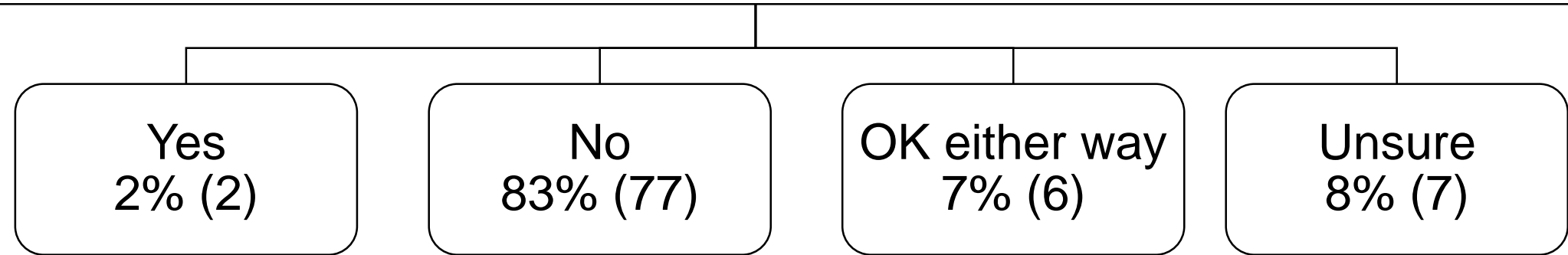
- 3 agencies
  - Parents and Children Together (Downtown-Kalihi, Oahu)
  - INPEACE (Waianae, Oahu)
  - Keiki O Ka Aina (Kona, Hawaii)

# OKQ Pilot – First Quarter Results

- 2 of 3 agencies fully implementing OKQ
- 134 non-pregnant, female primary caregivers were enrolled between Oct 1 – Dec 31, 2016
- 69% (92) asked OKQ



Would you like to become pregnant in the next year? n=92



*“Would you like to become pregnant in the next year?”*

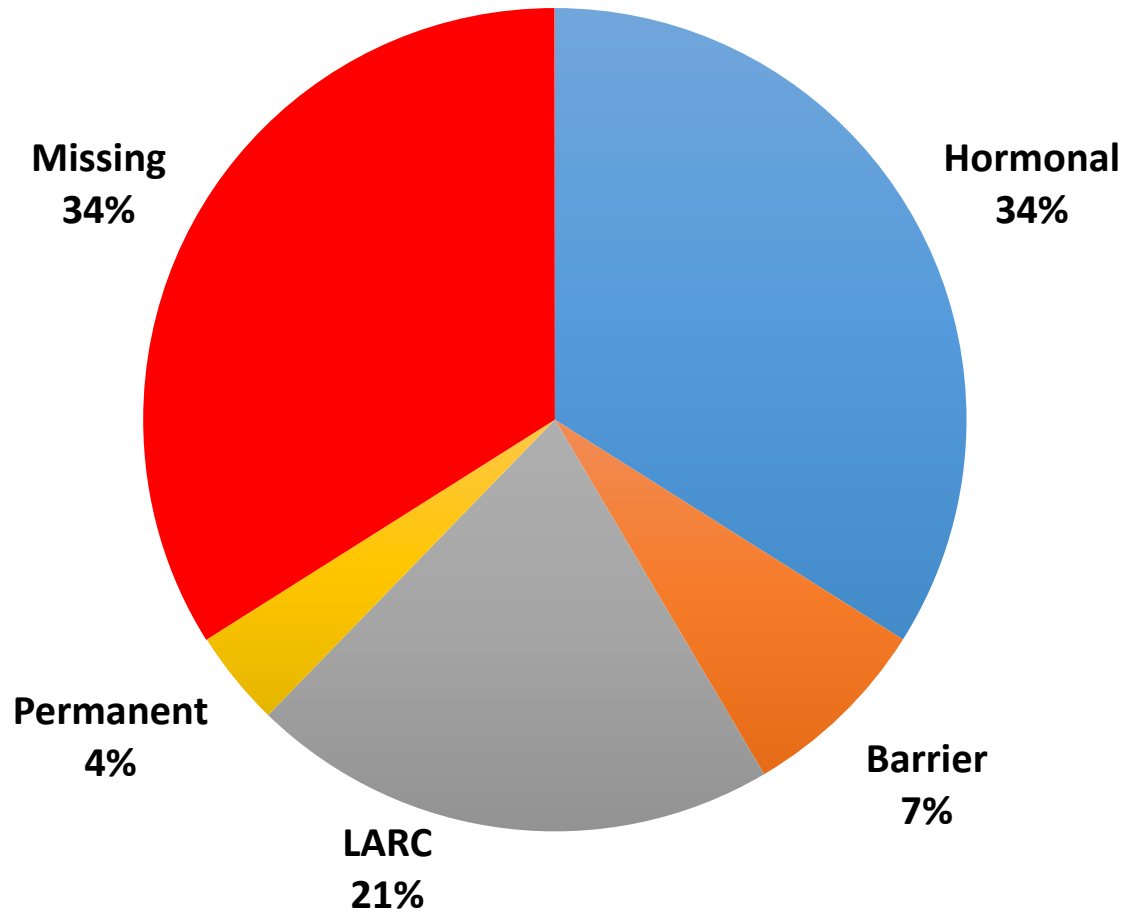
- Of the 2 participants that answered “Yes”:
  - 1 reported currently taking folic acid/prenatal vitamin
  - 1 reported not taking folic acid/prenatal vitamin, was referred to OB/GYN for preconception care

*“Would you like to become pregnant in the next year?”*

- Of the 77 participants that answered “No”:
  - 35% (27) reported not currently using any birth control method
  - 64% (49) reported currently using a birth control method
  - Missing n = 1

*“Would you like to become pregnant in the next year?”*

- Of the 13 participants that answered “Unsure” or “OK either way”:
  - 69% (9) reported not currently using any birth control method
  - 31% (4) reported currently using a birth control method

# Challenges

- Standardizing data collection for all agencies
- Avoiding double entry (demographics)
- Missing data
- Rolling enrollment/disenrollment changes target population

# Next Steps

- Resolve data collection
- Increase proportion of enrollees asked OKQ
  - Generated reports that identify participants not asked OKQ to assist in continuous quality improvement
- Train remainder of sites on OKQ
- Scale up to entire Hawaii Home Visiting Network
  - Sustainability
